





# Welcome to the Bury Grammar Schools' Digital Archive.

The Archive is divided into two sections entitled 'Boys' and 'Girls' Archives. Each section contains historical documents and photographs, along with Publications including 'The Clavian' and 'School Yearbooks' for the Boys and 'The Record' and 'School Magazines' for the Girls.

It is a valuable resource, providing fascinating information about pupils, staff and school life.

Each magazine has been digitally reproduced and each article extracted to provide a comprehensive search facility that enables the user to locate items of interest contained within a specific magazine or across the whole archive. In addition, each article is categorised to enable quick-link searches to be placed over the system.

The results are returned in a tabular format with the ability to select a title and view either the whole magazine or just the article as a pdf.

Alternatively, the user may view the magazines as a whole pdf, and scroll through using the page navigation option or the embedded bookmarks.

It is recommended that the system is viewed in Internet Explorer 9 or above, or the equivalent.

The user will require a pdf viewer to open the pdf files. These viewers may be obtained free of charge directly from <a href="https://www.adobe.com">www.adobe.com</a>.

#### Welcome Screen.

On entering the system, the 'Welcome Screen' will be displayed.

This screen gives access to the 'About the Archive'; 'Privacy Statement'; 'Copyright & Conditions of Use'; 'Contact BGS Archive Details'; 'Donate to BGS Archives' and a link to the BGS Websites, the Alumni Website and the Henry Dunster Society Website. It also provides the option to enter either the Boys' or the Girls' School archives.

This screen is the main 'Hub' for navigation between the main archives. It can be accessed at any time from within any part of the archive, and contains the menu and tabs to all areas of the archive.

BGS Boys' Archive This section contains the archives for the Boys' School.

BGS Girls' Archive This section contains the archives for the Girls' School. Donate to BGS Archive Opens the BGS Virgin Money Giving Page.

Contact BGS Archive Opens the default email programme complete with contact details.

This screen can be opened from any point in the archives by selecting the 'Home' option.

#### Browse Screen.

The 'Browse' screen provides the access to all of the different archives.

To access the main archives select the required archive at the top, 'BGS Boys' Archive' or 'BGS Girls' Archive'. For the purpose of the Manual, the 'BGS Boys' Archive' section will be used. Select the 'BGS Boys' Archive' tab at the top of the 'Welcome' screen.




The main 'Browse' screen will open.



From the 'Browse' screen, the different category archives access is available.

The system works on a 'Tree' style method, each section, once opened, will provide additional levels down to the actual image/document which will be displayed either as a pdf file or a jpg file.

A good example of the 'Tree' style method can be seen in the 'Photograph' section as detailed below:




The user can return to the archive 'Browse' screen from any archive by using the 'Back' button located in all archives, or by selecting the relevant 'BGS Boys' Archive' or 'BGS Girls' Archive' tab at the top of the screen

#### Viewing Magazines/Journals

All Magazines/Journals are PDF based files and will require a pdf reader or viewer to allow the files to be displayed.

Select the required archive.



This will open the archive in 'Decade' view, each decade where Magazines are available will be displayed as 'Icons'.

On Selecting a 'Decade', the individual 'Years' will be displayed.



Once a specific 'Year' has been chosen, the screen will display all available issues from that year.



To open the Issue Pdf file select the required 'Issue'.


# Viewing the Photographic Archives

Similar to the Journal archives, the 'Photographic' Archives uses the 'Tree' method for displaying the images.

Select the 'Photographs' section.



The 'Photograph' browse screen will be displayed.



Select the required 'Photographic' archive. ie 'Life at BGS'.

This will open the 'Thumbnail' page for all photographs allotted to this category.






To view the required 'Photograph' select the 'Thumbnail' of the image.

#### Zoom Function

Slide the zoom bar to the right to zoom into the image, or to the left to zoom out of the image.



# Roll of Honour

A commemoration of the Old Boys on the BGS War Memorial as we reach the centerary of the death of each serviceman.



Select the document and the pdf file will be displayed in a separate window.



Private Harry Ratcliffe, 1/4th Battalion Seaforth Highlanders, Died of Wounds 9th or 12th May 1915, aged 21.



Harry Rateliffe was the son of James Rateliffe and his wife Mary, of Limefield, Bury, Harry attended Bury Grammar School clongside his elder brother William and ecusits Fred Rateliffe. After leaving school, Harry trained to be a plumber. On 12th November 1914 he married Elma Harrison and the couple hived at 2 Harryton Street, Limefield. At around the same time Harry enlisted in the Scaforth Highlanders in Manchester. Why he chose this perticular regiment is unknown as there were no obvious Scottish farally connections. However, in the early months of the war the Scaforths did stage highly successful recutiling events in London and Manchester, which became known as the Helian (Highland) Raids'. Eventually, after complaints firm local regiments reached Pariament, the Scots were told to recruit only in their own areas.

Harry was originally possed to the 24th (Ternionial) Battalian Seaforth Highlanders but was sent out to France as part of a replacement draft to the 14th Battalian which had suffered heavy losses in battle. He joned No 1 (Tain and Diragwall) Company. It appears to have been a total coincidence that he ended up in the same unit as fellow Bury Grammar old boy John Whittam, they are the only BGS boys known to have served with the Seaforth Highlanders in the entire war. A few weeks after his arrival, Harry took part is the disastrous attack on Auters Ridge in which John Whittam was killed. Blarry was badly injured and died later of his wounds. There is some confusion as to his exact date of death. His Componwealth War Graves headsone records 5th May, the day of the Authers Ridge attack but other paperwork indicates that he survived until 12th May. He was originally buried in Vieille Chapelle Old Milliary Cometery but after the war the buriats here were relocated to the large Cabaret Rouge British Conservy of Souchez, some miles away. His grave reference is XVII.D.12. A weath was Inid on his grave during the 2005 Bury Grammar School bartleffelds tour and another visit is planted for October 2015. His widow subsequently renamed, becoming Elina Greenwood.

#### Searching

The 'Search All' facility allows a search across the whole system using keyword text entry.

The 'Search All' option provides the user with a 'Text' field search option.




Enter the required 'text' criteria into the 'Search' text field.

For this example we have used 'lewis'.

Select the 'Search' button, and the results will be displayed in a tabular results screen.



This screen will show in the 'First Column' from which section of the archive the search criteria was found.

In this example, 'lewis' was found in 'Old Girls Association', 'Girls\_Historical Documents', and the 'Boys\_Historical Documents' archives.

By selecting one of the icons on the right side of the results panel, the user may open the 'Text' file, the 'Article' pdf file (if available) or the full 'Pdf' file.



Select this symbol to open the PDF file directly from the search screen.



Select this symbol to open the text file for the article/document/photograph directly from the search screen.

The results panel can be navigated by use of the arrows above the results section.

To place a new search, simply enter the new 'Text' criteria into the 'Search' text field, and select the 'Search' button.
